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## ERA High-Quality Journal Article Incentive Scheme

### 1. Summary

To support research excellence and strengthen the College's ERA submission in 2023 this scheme provides an incentive for CBGL teaching and research (balanced) and research only academics to publish in high-ranked journals as identified by the ARC in the 2018 ERA round. An award of \$1,000 per article, to be used for research activities, will be given to any CBGL teaching and research (balanced) and research only researcher to publish in one of the top 10% or A\* ranked journals identified in the ERA 2018 Journal List. In cases where an article has two or more authors, the \$1,000 award will be split evenly between the CBGL authors listed.

### 2. Eligibility

To be eligible for an award the following conditions must be met:

- All CBGL teaching and research (balanced) and research only staff members and currently enrolled HDR students are eligible
- The journal article must be published in one of the top 10% or A\* ranked journals identified in the ERA 2018 Journal List
- The journal article must have been accepted for publishing after 1 August 2020 i.e. no retrospective awards will be permitted
- The article must be published
