Why a Master Plan?

The last time Flinders University undertook a Bedford Park Campus Master Plan was in 1992, over thirty years ago. Since then, there have been significant and rapid advances across the tertiary education sector, learning and teaching, technology, sustainability, research, student and staff expectations and much more. A new Master Plan is required to maximise the future development opportunities of the campus and create an outstanding campus experience for students, staff and visitors.

What is the Master Plan?

A blueprint to guide, inform and prioritise physical infrastructure investments to ensure our campus continues to support Flinders University's strategic objectives. It can cover a wide range of topics including types of land use and development, transport and parking, urban design, campus activities, connections, outdoor areas and open spaces.

Last year, we engaged with the University and broader community to hear your important insights about the most valued aspects of the Bedford Park Campus, areas needing improvement, and innovative ideas for potential inclusion in the Master Plan.


